The College Bound Scholarship is a state-funded program for 7th and 8th grade students in Washington. To be eligible, a student's family income must meet the income eligibility requirements based on annual income and family size. For example, a family of four that earns less than \$40,800 a year qualifies to apply. The family must also meet the income requirements at the time of graduation as reported on the FAFSA (a standard federal student aid application). Students must also graduate with at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA, be a good citizen, and stay crime free, and apply for an eligible college in Washington State.
